Very light, airy rosé

El Coto Rioja Rosado* (£20.00, £4.00, £5.20, £7.50)

Another excellent wine from El Coto – a rose with a bit more bite and flavour

Sancerre Rosé, Domaine Sautereau (£35)

Beautiful crisp, elegant rose with real flavour and a finish – a taste of the banks of the Loire in summertime

Mezzora Montepulciano d'Abruzzo (£16.00, £3.30, £4.30, £6.00)

Great value quaffing red house wine

SANAMA Reserve Merlot (£18.00, £3.50, £4.70, £6.50)

Good classic Chilean wine, none of the insipid quality of some cheap Merlots

De Bortoli Heathcote Shiraz (£20.00, £4.00, £5.30, £7.00))

Wonderfully powerful and aromatic deep red wine

Painted Wolf Pinotage* (£20.00, £4.00, £5.30, £7.00)

Fantastic example of South Africa's signature red grape –Burgundy style at half the price

El Coto Rioja (£22.00, £4.50, £6.00, £8.00)

Certainly won't disappoint Rioja fans - heavy tannins and good flavour

Bodega Piedra Negra Malbec (£22.00, £4.50, £6.00, £8.00)

Argentina make great Malbec – and this is one of them

Spice Route Grenache (Swartland) (£24)

Full flavour but not too heavy; sweet, jammy notes with more than a hint of berries

Chateau Caillou les Martins St Emilion (£24)

Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon combine to make this flavoursome Bordeaux

Chianti Rufina (£24)

The UK gets some proper Chianti now (at least until March), not the old tosh in string bottles they used to send us: powerful, rich and satisfying
